## **Post Summary**

The Gillan Lab at Trinity College Dublin ([www.gillanlab.com](http://www.gillanlab.com)) is looking for a Research Fellow to work on an exciting project that will develop passive smartphone metrics of cognitive fluctuations, incorporating research in large general population samples as well as patient groups, including psychiatric populations and patients with Lewy body dementia.

The role arises from a grant from the Health Research Board in the Republic of Ireland. There is considerable scope for input in design of research questions that fall within the remit of using smartphone data to study dynamic fluctuations in cognition over time, using both passive and active assessments.

The Research Fellow will join a growing team of PhD students, postdoctoral fellows, and app developers in the Gillan lab and will participate in regular lab meetings, learn about diverse methodologies in mental health science and have the opportunity to attend international conferences annually.

## **Standard Duties and Responsibilities of the Post**

The research fellow will be responsible for data cleaning and aggregation of time series of passive sensor data, including developing novel methods for its analysis and validation. They will maintain the highest of security and privacy standards in line with Trinity College Dublin data protection policies and procedures. In addition, the postdoc will direct a research assistant in the recruitment of data from clinical populations, including a small sample with Lewy body dementia. This work will involve a process of public and patient involvement, with workshops and interactive feedback designed to make sure mobile sensing is acceptable and suitable for a given population.

More generally, postdocs are expected to participate fully in lab life, attending regular meetings and collaborating with other lab members. As a senior role in the lab, the ideal candidate will be mature, responsible and show readiness for academic leadership.

On completion of this post, it is envisioned that the Research Fellow will have gained the organisational, technical and leadership skills necessary for making the transition to Principal Investigator of their own laboratory. That means that during their time in the lab, they will be

expected to assist in the supervision of junior team members and will be encouraged to apply for independent research funding and will become increasingly autonomous over the course of their tenure in the lab. Though not required, postdocs will have the opportunity to take on some light teaching if they wish.

## **The Selection Process in Trinity**

The Selection Committee (Interview Panel) may include members of the Academic and Administrative community together with External Assessor(s) who are expert in the area. Applications will be acknowledged by email. If you do not receive confirmation of receipt within 1 day of submitting your application online, please contact the named hiring lead on the job specification immediately and prior to the closing date/time.

Given the degree of co-ordination and planning to have a Selection Committee available on the specified date, the University regrets that it may not be in a position to offer alternate selection dates. Where candidates are unavailable, reserves may be drawn from a shortlist. Outcomes of interviews are notified in writing to candidates and are issued no later than 5 working days following the selection day.
